EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

for **Brother Dr. Avery D. Kenly**

Candidate for Outstanding Alumni Brother of the Year

This Executive Summary and the adjoining book provides documentation and highlights of my 21 years of uninterrupted Fraternal Service to Alpha locally, regionally, and nationally with a heightened focus on activities within the last fraternal year.

In the Eta Lambda chapter, I've served in over 15 different leadership positions and in 2003, worked on the committee that raised over \$200,000 for the MLK Memorial Project. This year I was for the **first time ever** named the 3x chapter Brother of the Year and earned **another first by simultaneously being voted as the chapter's Charles W. Green Award of Merit winner.** Less than two months later, I was named the Georgia District Brother of the Year for the second time in three years (2019 & 2021). Within metro Atlanta, I've served as a committee member and speaker for our Metro Atlanta Founders Day activities, Education Committee member, Ritual Team Member, and facilitated IMDP trainings for the North Georgia cluster. On the District level I've served on the Education and National Programs committees and created a standards based Voter Registration Lesson aligned with national teaching standards. In 2020, I was appointed by our Georgia District Director to serve as the chair of the Georgia District Project Alpha program. Regionally, I serve on the Life Membership committee and Nationally, I serve on the Project Alpha committee. I've also had the pleasure of serving as an awards judge at both District and Regional Conventions. During the convention this past summer ('21) in Indianapolis, In., I had the pleasure to serve the Fraternity as a member of the Rules and Credentials committee **personally** creating the online delegate certification process, working each day to certify delegates, man the March of Dimes table, and serve as a panel member for a forum in collaboration with Project Alpha and the Aids Health Foundation. Lastly, I've served as a delegate on every level; having attended 5 general, 11 regional, and 14 district conventions.

I am serving this fraternal year (2021-2022) as the Eta Lambda Chapter Director of Education and have already initiated a chapter book club, **PERSONALLY raised \$17,680 for scholarships**, developed a database of scholarships for graduating seniors, and organized a forum hosted by former scholarship winners now in college. Because of the numerous programs I facilitated this fraternal year, I have impacted 1,880 students and 3,168 individuals in total. As the immediate past



Eta Lambda Director of National Programs I co-chaired all of its sub-committees and still serve each -- in Project Alpha, I hosted a seminar on sexual awareness and interactions with the police. I'm a staunch supporter of March of Dimes where I have served as the **chapter's largest fundraiser four years in a row**. I mentor students in our Go To High School Go To College program held at Washington High School, the first public high school in the State of Georgia for African Americans. My work continued with A Voteless People Is A Hopeless People where I held 8 in person voter registration drives, 2 virtual voter registration drives, and coordinated a Virtual Voter Engagement Week registering in total 1,235 citizens in 2020-2021. As a member of our Civic Action Committee, I helped organize Brothers to become poll workers leading to 10 Brothers being certified as poll workers with 4 eventually becoming poll managers. Finally, I helped facilitate our Brother's Keeper program by offering rides to meetings and creating a match program to pair young and senior Brothers. I organized the 80th Birthday and 60th Alphasaversary of Brother Lloyd Givens, the 94th Birthday and 71st Alphasaversary of Brother Bob Willis, and the 100th Birthday and 73rd Alphasaversary of Brother William Robie.

Personally, I've been married for 19 years, and I'm the proud #girdad of a 17-year-old who is a senior and has maintained a 4.16 GPA. She recently published her first article titled the "The Future of Activism". I've accumulated over 490 community service hours in less than 9 months (May '21 – February '22) and hold membership in more than 25 professional and civic organizations.

Professionally, I am the Coordinating Supervisor of Professional Learning for the Clayton County Public Schools District where I oversee the professional learning for over 7,000 employees. **Fraternally**, I lead our annual coat drive, chair our scholarship committee which awards \$10,000 annually to deserving students, assist with our Thanksgiving Basket giveaway, and participated in MedShare where we packed and sent over 70,000 medical supplies to developing countries. **Communally**, I am a member of the Washington High School Go Team where I help oversee the strategic planning for the school. I serve on Warren Memorial United Methodist Church's Sesquicentennial capital campaign and communications committee where I have led the effort to raise over \$55,000 for the campaign. I have volunteered at the Atlanta Public Schools Back to School Bash helping over 9,000 families with school supplies and found the apex of my community service within my support of our chapter's Boys Books and Brotherhood program where in 2020, we assisted 13 students write and release original books which generated \$169,000 in scholarships.



I am most proud of helping my Brothers in their own progression. I was happy to support my collegiate Brothers at Morehouse College, Clark Atlanta University and Georgia State University where I co-sponsored voter registration forums with each chapter, donated to the Morehouse Chapter's Gift of Giza Christmas Toy Drive, donated to the Alpha Phi Chapter's Hands in for Haiti initiative, assisted the Brothers from Zeta Mu with the AUC Sandwich Run, and supported Brothers as they transitioned from college to career even helping four recent graduates secure employment. Helping my alumni Brothers, I created the first Alpha Educators day, supported the campaign for Brothers running for office, and patronized Brother's businesses. Finally, I was most pleased to support Brothers Ernest Holmes (Spring 18) and Tavis Thompson (Spring 19) alumni of the Alpha Rho Chapter at Morehouse College, organize a virtual Tech Day where we exposed over 3,600 minority students to some of the leading technology companies across the globe. Additionally, I was named the Director of Student Recruitment of the organization (CodeHouse) where we started a scholarship program in 2021 for 29 students each receiving \$20,000 in scholarships (totaling \$580,000 in scholarships). This fall '22, this program will add an additional 45 students each receiving \$20,000 in scholarships (totaling \$900,000 in scholarships). I'm pleased to say that this organization is now incorporated and together, we serve on its Board of Directors.

When Covid-19 hit, for seven weeks, I rode a school bus to deliver over 1,500 meals to Atlanta Public Schools students - while simultaneously delivering food to our senior brothers. Within the Black Lives Matter movement, I marched with college Brothers in protest, advocated at the Georgia capitol, helped pass GA's Hate Crime Bill, and volunteered as a pallbearer for the late Rayshard Brooks who was fatally shot in the back by the police.

Since our last regional convention, I've accumulated **more** than **490 community service hours**, served as my chapter's highest fundraiser **for March of Dimes**, became a certified poll worker, registered **more** than **1,000 citizens**, helped establish a scholarship program serving **29 college students** yielding **\$580,000 in scholarships ('21)** and **\$900,000 for 45 college students ('22)**, exposed **more** than **3000 students** to careers in the tech field, delivered **more** than **1,500 meals** during the pandemic, marched for Black lives and was named the back to back to back **(3x) Eta Lambda Chapter Brother of the Year, the Charles W. Greene Award of Merit Winner, and the Georgia District Brother of the Year!**

NATIONAL PROGRAMS AND SPECIAL INITIATIVES: Go To High School Go To College (Project ExC²EL)

Brother Kenly currently serves as a member of the Project ExC²EL committee which serves as Eta Lambda's arm of the Fraternity's 'Go-to- High School, Go-to-College' national program. The program mentor's students from Washington High School and Brown Middle School in Atlanta. These programs are geared to assist in: retention of students in school and lead, eventually, to the pursuit of a post-secondary educational experience;

reduction/elimination in the participation in criminal activity; reduction in truancy and juvenile delinquency; development of good behavior; development of self-esteem among participants, and how to prepare for the future.

Since 2018, Brother Kenly has gone to Washington High School for weekly mentoring sessions on topics such as personal responsibility and on developing a life vision plan (moving virtual in 2020). As a chapter, through the mentorship processes, we have consistently been able to positively impact the lives of our mentees.

Participants in Project EXC2EL at Booker T. Washington High School graduate at a rate higher than the school's general population. During the 2019-2020 school year, **100% of Mentees graduated** from high school versus the general population average of 73.1%. Additionally, all graduates from this class were accepted into a four-year institution and amassed over \$160,000 in scholarship money. In 2021, the program consisted of the class Valedictorian, Star Student, Mr. Washington H.S., and amassed over \$3,562,026.28 in scholarships. Students in this year's class will be attending schools such as Howard University, Dartmouth College, Livingstone College, and Florida A&M University. Lastly, no Project Excel mentees have been involved in unacceptable behavior since being involved with our program. Booker T. Washington High School is the first public high school for African-Americans Georgia.



NATIONAL PROGRAMS AND SPECIAL INITIATIVES: Brother's Keeper

Brother Kenly has co-chaired Brother's Keeper as the Director of National Programs and has worked to advocate and improve the quality of life for senior Brother in the chapter. As one of the oldest chapters in Alpha, we have a large number of senior Brothers with a variety of needs. During the past year, Brother Kenly has made a conscious effort to check in with senior Brothers, deliver food, and support the chair in fulfilling the mission of Brother's Keeper.







As the immediate past Director of National Programs, Brother Kenly worked with the Boys, Books, and Brotherhood program to help promote the partnership between Raising Expectations and Young Authors Publishing. Through this partnership with Eta Lambda, 13 mentees wrote original books which are published and available for sale. This collaboration provides a 325% increase of students impacted from 4 student scholarships to 13 and a total of **\$169,000 in potential scholarships** dollars. For this effort, **100%** of the money accrued through the sale of the books go directly to scholarship funds for the authors.


